



- *Eastern Bluebirds* occur across eastern North America and south as far as Nicaragua
- The oldest recorded Eastern Bluebird was at least 10 years, 6 months old
- Eastern Bluebirds typically have more than one successful brood per year
- Eastern Bluebirds are a great prospect for nest boxes, like the one in the picture above taken at [Kalmbach Memorial Park](#)
- Only the female Eastern Bluebird builds the nest and incubates the eggs
- Eastern Bluebirds typically have more than one successful brood per year
- Eastern Bluebirds eat mostly insects, wild fruit and berries
- Male Eastern Bluebirds are a brilliant **royal blue** on the back and head, and warm **red-brown** on the breast
